- A) A program’s GPA, language, or financial requirements help you narrow down your program options. What is the GPA requirement for program/s you are interested in? What financial resources can you utilize in order to fund a study abroad experience? Have you taken university-level classes in a foreign language (if applicable)?
- B) It is important for you to find a program that offers courses that are applicable to your academic goals. Please have a list of the WU courses you have yet to complete from your academic advisor or from your major/minor’s website nearby when searching on-line course listings. Does the program you want to attend offer courses that are applicable to your academic goals while abroad?
- C) Some programs have no language requirements (including many universities in non-English speaking countries); however, popular destinations such as France, Germany, & Spain can have some sort of language requirement. What language are the courses conducted in? If you are interested in taking courses in a foreign language, how many semesters of university foreign language experience are required? Have you taken the necessary amount of university-level language courses?
- D) Programs around the world have different academic calendars. For example, southern hemisphere universities may have classes from February to June (Semester 1) and July to November (Semester 2) and many European universities end their first semester in February. Do the dates of attendance at the program of your choice allow for you to take WU courses before and after studying abroad?
- E) If you are not participating in a WU Exchange Program and have selected an affiliate program provider or will propose a Student Initiated Program, what is the cost of the program (tuition, room and board)? Have you identified what is and what is not included in the price?
- F) Living and study abroad requires an open mind: Pre-departure “research” is essential for a positive experience. Mentally prepare yourself for surprises. No matter how much you think you know about your host country, not everything is going to match up to your expectations. Use books, newspapers, movies, study abroad materials, etc. to research your destination and familiarize yourself with local issues and customs, but keep your preconceptions flexible.
